

SPECULATORS BID UP PRICES IN WALL STREET

Favorable Financial Development Prove Encouragement as Market Opens

BRAZILIAN SMELTERS LEAD AT MONTREAL

Bank of Montreal, Declining 3 Points, Is Weakest Spot at Opening

NEW YORK, Nov. 13.—Encouraged by a series of unusually favorable financial developments, including the retention of the 3½ per cent. red count rate by the New York Federal Reserve Bank, and the \$5 cash extra on General Motors common, speculators for the advance started to bid up prices vigorously at the opening of today's market. Chrysler opened 6½ points higher, Dupont 6, Mack Trucks 3½, American Can 8 and Allied Chemical 2.
