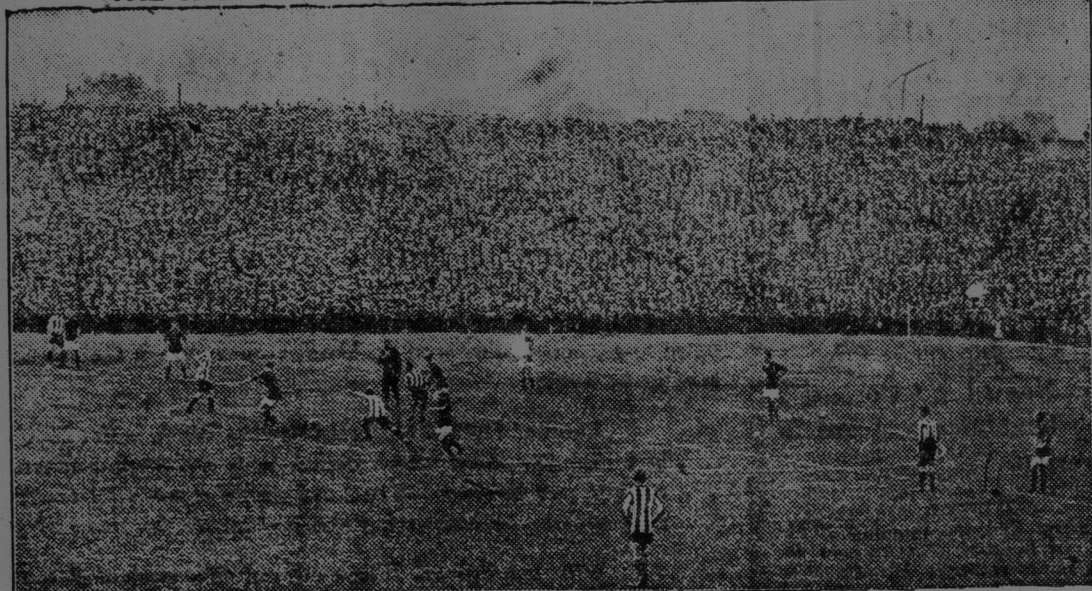
### THE TURF

## FEARS EXTINCTION OF WILD FLOWERS

(New York Times.)

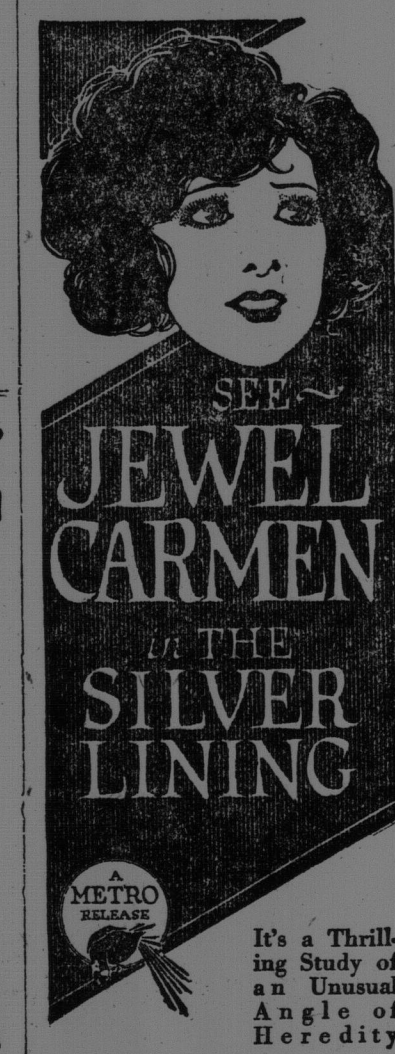
Persons with large country estates who import trees, shrubs and flowers from all over the world would do their own country real service if they would start preserves for native wild plants and flowers which are in danger of extermination, says Dr. E. T. Wherry, Government chemist and crystallographer, of the Washington Bureau of Chemistry who gave an illustrated talk upon "How to Grow Wild Flowers" at the New York Botanical Garden lately.

The preservation of wild flowers and their cultivation has been a personal hobby with Dr. Wherry. He has applied chemical methods to the study of the soil and in the grounds of his suburban home in Washington many hundreds of wild flowers of the country have been made to feel at home. He emphasizes the fact that they are growing on what he calls a "suburban lot" to show that
