SESSION 1888-89.

The Twenty-third Session will commence on Tuesday, 2nd October next, at 8 o'clock p. m., when the introductory lecture will be delivered by Chs. McEachran, V. S. Students are requested to be present at the opening and to attend the introductory lectures in all the classes, otherwise they will miss valuable elementary lectures.

## Matriculation.

With a view to raise the educational standard of the class, each student, previous to his admission, must produce a certificate of educational acquirements, or submit himself to a matriculation examination in writing, reading aloud, grammar, dictation, simple and compound rules of arithmetic, and simple rule of three. It will be seen that this preliminary examination is far from severe, yet it affords a certain guarantee that uneducated men will not be admitted.

Prof. A. N. Shewan, M. A., will hold the matriculation examination on Saturday, September 29th, at 3 p. m., and all the students intending to enter on the course should present themselves then for examination, those possessing certificates of education or previous matriculation should produce them for the approval of the examiner.

Members of the Medical Profession are required to attend one full session, are not required to matriculate. Allowances will be made to medical students or others who can produce certified class tickets for attendance on any of the subjects embraced in the curriculum from any recognized College or University.

## Course of Lectures.

The College course extends over three sessions of six months each. Lectures in Botany, Histology, Chemistry and Physiology are attended
