

LOCKE, *Hon.* John. L.

Family removed from Massachusetts to Nova Scotia previous to the first Am. Revolution. They settled in Queen's Co., but removed to Shelburne, in which Co. they have since resided. B. 15 Sept., 1825. Ed. in Liverpool, Eng., and at Shelburne, N. S. M. Jany., 1851, Miss Mary Elizabeth Churchill. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, N. S., from 1856 to 1857, and again from 1860 to 1863. Sat for Shelburne Township in House of Assembly, N. S., from 1851 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*Locke's Island, N. S.*

MACPHERSON, *Hon.* David Lewis. C.

B. in Scotland, 12th Sept. 1818. Ed. at the Inverness Royal Academy. Came to Can. 1835. M. in June 1844 Elizabeth Sarah, eldest dau. of William Molson, Esq., of Montreal. Is a mem. of the Corporation of the Collegiate Institute, London, Ont., and a director of the Toronto Rolling Mills Company. Represented Saugeen division in Leg. Council, Can., from Oct., 1864, until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867.—*Toronto.*

MALHIOT, *Hon.* Charles, M. D. L.

Is of French descent. S. of the late Lieut. Col. Hon. F. X. Malhiot, M. P. P., and M. L. C. in the L. C. Legislature, Seigneur of Verchères, and of Julie de Laperrière, his wife. B. at Verchères, 1808. Ed. at Mont-
