HORNE, JAMES WELTON. (*Vancouver.*)

Father a native of Saxe Cobourg, came to America when a young man and after a brief residence in the U.S., removed to Can. B. 3 Nov., 1853 at Toronto, Ont. Went to Vancouver in 1886 and is Presdt. and Director of several important local corporations. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Vancouver.*

HUNTER, JOSEPH. (*Comox*)

B. in Aberdeen, Scot., and ed. at the Grammar school, and Marischal Coll. Is a Civil Engineer. Settled in B.C. 1864. Is a Councillor of Comox. Was a mem. of the first Assem. of B.C. after the entry of the Province in to the Dominion Confederation. Re-elected at last g.e. *Victoria, B.C.*

KEITH THOMAS. (*Nanaimo City.*)

B. in Belfast, Irel., 1863. Is engaged in mining. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e.—*Nanaimo.*

KELLIE, JAMES M. [*West Kootenay.*]

Parents were natives of Morayshire, Scot., and settled in Ontario. B. in Cobourg, Ont., 6 Dec., 1848. Is engaged in quartz mining. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Revelstoke, B.C.*

KITCHEN, THOMAS EDWIN. [*Westminster.*]

Third s. of Thomas and Jane Kitchen, of Dalton in Furness, Lancashire, Eng. B. 18 Dec., 1852, at Haverthwaite, near Lakeside, Windermere, Lancashire. Ed., and was pupil teacher at National schools, Wimbledon, Surrey. M., Feb., 1882, Margaret C. Skovgaard, Bornholm, Denmark. Is a farmer and is Reeve of Chilli-
