Eld. s. of the late Mr. James Stirton, one of the earliest settlers at Guelph. B. in Forfarshire, Scot., 1816. Has been a Magistrate for the past twenty years. Was Reeve of Tp. of Puslinch for some years. Is a captain in the Militia. Sat for South Wellington in Can. Assembly from g.e., 1857, until the Union. Returned to Commons at g.e., 1867; re-elected, by acclamation, at last g.e. A Liberal, and opposed to the present Govt.—*Guelph, Ont.*
