A day-long parent education workshop Nov. 6 will provide parents with an opportunity to hear guest speakers on a variety of relevant subjects. The workshop will be held at St. Stephen's-on-the-Hill United Church, Indian Rd. It is entitled Meeting the Challenges of Family Living Today.
