Memorandum .

Deputy Minister,-

The Kamloops Indian reserve was set apart by the Joint Commission in 1877. There is no report accompanying the Minutes of Decision of this Commission.

The Minute relating to the Kamloops reserve concludes with the fellowing,-

"The reserve to include all the land within the above "boundaries with the exception of the piece on St.Paul's "Creek, 160 chains by 20 chains, known as the Schiedam Ranch."

You may note on the blue print herewith that it is situated altogether within the limits of the reserve and near its eastern boundary and is indicated thereon as two lots, viz:-Let 1, Group 6 and Let 2, Group 6. We have no record of the title under which the said Schiedam Ranch was then or is now held.
