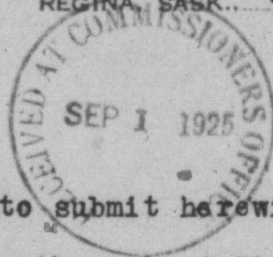

REGINA, SASK. August 26th 1925.



Sir:-

I beg to submit herewith my report on the Annuity Payments throughout Ile a la Crosse Agency, Treaty No.10 for 1925.

On Sunday 14th June I left Regina at 11.55 o'clock P.M. in company with Dr.H.G.Cameron and R.Staveley, for Prince Albert, at which point we were to meet our canoe men, and a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. We reached Prince Albert on Monday the 15th at 10.45. I got into communication with Inspector Jennings about the constable who was to escort the party, and found that he would report to me at the hotel in time to escort the money on board the train, Tuesday morning. I then went to the bank with Dr. Cameron, and checked over the money.

The following morning at 8.40 our Indians arrived from The Pas, and at 11.30 a.m. we started north to Big River, which place we reached at 6.30 P.M. We went into camp, and spent the evening overhauling our equipment. On Wednesday the 17th, at 3.00 o'clock P.M. we launched out on Crooked or Cowan Lake en route for Isle a la Crosse. We travelled up the
