Sir,

I have to inform you that Mr. Charles Thornton, of Echo Bay, has written the Department to know if he can purchase the E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 17, Macdonald, ^{states} and that you advised him that you having lost through fire, the papers in your Office, could not give him the information he desired. I am now enclosing herewith a blue print copy of the Plan of Sec. 17, shewing the portions of marsh land and accretions to the main land which have been sold, in accordance with instructions given you in letter of the 29th May, 1901.

You will observe from this Plan that the Southerly 55 Acres of this Quarter Section have been sold under Sale No. 204, and that 2 Acres of marsh land together with 106 Acres of accretions to the main land, are still in the market.

I might add that the upset price of both the marsh lands and accretions is 50¢ per Acre, either Cash, or 1/5 Cash, and the balance in four equal annual instalments with Interest thereon @ 6 % from date of Sale to date of payment.
