Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant, I beg to say that the samples of print and tweed submitted have been examined with the result that the tweed and sample of blue print have been <sup>found</sup> satisfactory, but the sample of red print is of much lighter weight and cannot be accepted. Red print equal in weight to the blue print should be supplied.

If the trousers are made of tweek similar to the sample submitted and finished in a manner similar to the standard sample, they will be accepted. It would be well to forward to the Department a pair of trousers in order that it may be seen how they will be finished before having them all manufactured. If found satisfactory the balance can be made up.

The samples are returned herewith.
