Ottawa, July 18, 1916.

Sir:-

In reply to your letter of the 10th instant asking for instructions as to holding the approaching election, I have to request that you will arrange to receive nominations on Wednesday, the 26th instant, and to hold the election a week later, namely, on Wednesday, the 2nd proximo. It is presumed that this letter will reach you in time to enable you to have a notice posted up on Sunday, the 23rd instant, on the door of the village church and at any other suitable and customary place announcing the dates and hours of nominations and election and the place where the same will be held.

It is thought that with the assistance of some reliable member of the band you should be able to receive the nominations without any trouble; but in view of possible difficulty at the election, the Department has decided to send Mr. John A. Cooke to assist you on that day.
