

Ottawa, January 5, 1918.

Madam,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 1st instant in reference to the amount of salary paid you for your services for the period which you taught the No. 2 School on Walpole Island during the quarter ending December 31st, last.

In reply I beg to say that the return received shows that you taught fifty-eight days. Payment of salaries is based on two hundred teaching days in the year and you were paid 58/200 of your salary of \$600.00 or \$174.00.

The only remark on your return with reference to holidays is as follows, - "School closed one day, teacher absent".

It is considered that you were paid full salary for the period you taught during the December quarter. If you decide to remain in this school til the 30th of June, next, and teach two hundred days, you will be paid the full yearly salary.

A copy of the Indian Day School Regulations is enclosed herewith, which will show you the method adopted in the payment of salaries for broken periods.

The Department is pleased to learn that you will resume your duties at this school for a further period of three months.
