The Reserve Ration Storeroom was kept locked at all times, the key being kept in the Q.M. Stores. The values shown for the following articles was obtained from the C. 1/c R.A.S.C. Supply Depot, Inverness.

duly sworn states:-

I was told by Sgt. Greenwood to go up to Mr. MacDonald's farm and tell him I have fifty pounds of sugar. I went up to MacDonald's and told him and he asked me how much I wanted for it. I told him I did not know. I came down to Camp with Mr. MacDonald. I then went into the canteen and got Sgt. Greenwood and told him that MacDonald was outside the canteen. Greenwood came out and spoke a few words to MacDonald. I could not tell what they were talking about at the time. Pte. Stephenson was in company with Sgt. Greenwood and MacDonald outside the canteen. When I had been in the Canteen about ten or fifteen minutes Pte. Stephenson and Sgt. Greenwood came into the canteen. Sgt. Greenwood came in a few minutes after me. Stephenson when he came in bought me three bottles of beer. I never saw him after that.

Q.1 Did you at any time handle any foodstuffs for Sgt. Greenwood?
A.1 No, sir.

Q.2 Did you at any time see Mr. MacDonald hand over any monies to Sgt. Greenwood?
A.2 No, sir.

The accused proceeds to cross-examine the witness.

Q.3 What time and date was I supposed to have told you about 50 lbs. of sugar?
A.3 I cannot state what time and date it was.

Q.4 Were you doing much drinking that day.
A.4 I was drinking alright that day.

Q.5 Did you walk up to MacDonalds?
A.5 No, I cycled up.

Q.6 Did you return back to camp on your cycle?
A.6 I was on the bicycle but was hanging on to the car with my hand.
