


Figure 2. Area in the vicinity of lake Kipawa showing the multitude of lakes; about 27 per cent of the surface area is water.

is shown in Figure 2. In this area, 535 square miles in extent, there a over one hundred and thirty-five lakes and approximately 27 per cent the surface is covered by water.
