

CONDITIONS OF
CARY's
CIRCULATING LIBRARY

I. Subscription for one month, three shillings and six-pence; for three months, nine shillings; for six months, fifteen shillings; and for twelve months, one guinea. The money to be paid at the time of subscribing. And single Books will be let out at the following rates:—4tos. 6d.; 8vos. 4d.; and 12mos. 1d. per volume.

II. Each subscriber is entitled to two books at a time, which he may change once a day, and not oftener.

III. Any book torn or damaged, while in the possession of a reader, must be paid for; or, if it belong to a set, the set must be paid for according to its value.

IV. No reader to keep any book beyond a week. Non-subscribers who transgress this rule, are to pay for every subsequent week the same as the first.

V. So long as books are kept in the possession of subscribers, (from whatever cause it may happen,) they will be considered as subscribers, and charged accordingly.

VI. No subscriber to lend any book to a non-subscriber, or others, it being thereby liable to be lost; and consequently, the subscriber in whose name it is lent, will be obliged to pay for it.

VII. Readers are required to return the books, about their being sent for.

VIII. Readers to have the use of a Catalogue, in the library: but those who choose to take one home, are to pay for it.
