Any even numbered section of Dominica Lands in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to p wide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less. ENTRY.

ENTRY. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Con-missioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10,00 is charged for a homestead entry. HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been cranted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans-

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is, eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for hy such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining pattent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

with the father or mother. (3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestend, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain-ing patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead. (4) If the settier has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails binnshi of the provisions of Clausee (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acress of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides sou acres substantially fenced. The putylinger of a support acres is matching by law of those settlers

acres substantially fenced. The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the dutks upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1880. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again throw open for entry. APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give air monther notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to dr so.
