

Synopsis of Canadian North-West.

HOMESTEAD REGULACIONS

A NY even-numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominon Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of an intending homesteader.

DUTIES — (1) At least rix months' residence upon and cul-tivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so destres, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by hin, not less than eighty (99) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also done, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farm-ing land owned by himself, must notify the agent for the district of such intention.
