PREPARATORY COMMITTEES &c.

The Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Church of Eastern British America will be held in Halifax, (N.S.) on Wednesday, the 23rd day of June next, at the Brunswick Street Church. We subjoin some important extracts from the Minutes.

THE SLAVE TRADE.—It strikes us that if the principle now contended for in the report of the Committee on Foreign Relations be adopted as correct, viz: that a vessel bearing the American flag, cannot be boarded by a foreign vessel in order to ascertain whether she is engaged in the slave trade, then the American flag should be used to restrain the American slave trade, for it will continue to be carried on wherever it may be profitable, and under the American flag. It is true the American flag should protect whatever it rightfully covers—but it should not be permitted to cover any illegal or improper trade or traffic. Foreign Governments have a right to know whether the vessel which bears the American flag is fairly and justly entitled to the privilege; and how is that fact to be ascertained without boarding her?

We should ask nothing which is not high and noble, and to which, if wrong, the measure of General Jackson. Suppose our coast to be infested by a nest of pirates who were content with depredations upon commerce—should we not take steps to seize and punish them? We think so. But, if the doctrine now advanced to correct such pirates would only have to keep France, or other powers, and, by our own principle, we should be prohibited from boarding such vessels to ascertain whether they were in reality pirates, or pretended to be. We do not think the principle which we are now endeavoring to establish, will work well upon trial.—*Baltimore Clipper.*

Latest from Europe and the East!

Arrival of the Europa.

THE ROYAL MAIL STEAMSHIP Europa arrived here at about twelve o'clock on Tuesday, the 17th inst. and a half day from Liverpool. She brings English dates to the 5th instant, from which we give copious extracts of the most important news.

The Ministerial arrangements rendered necessary by the resignation of Lord Ellenborough have been completed. Lord Stanley has returned from the Colonial Department, and appointed to the now highly responsible office of President of the Board of Control; and Sir Edward Bouverie Lytton has succeeded him as Secretary for the Colonies.

A very important motion was carried in the popular branch of the legislature, by Captain Vivian, which, if literally carried, would bring the House of Commons, and indeed, the whole of the army, within the ken of the House of Commons.

Mr. Potter, Esq., had arrived in London as bearer of very important despatches from the United States Government to the Court of St. James.

The United States Government is very anxious on the subject of the recent proceedings in the Gulf of Mexico, and it is not apprehended that anything serious will arise out of the business.

There appears to be no doubt that the affair can be speedily and satisfactorily settled between the two Governments. In the House of Commons the language respecting the late proceedings by the American Government against the British cruisers was of the most respectful and conciliatory character. Government was investigating the subject, and the papers would soon be laid before Parliament.

By the latest telegraphic despatch from Paris there was a rumor that Marshal Pelissier had been removed from his post of Ambassador at London.—The Times correspondent, however, did not give credence to the report. There were also rumors in Paris of another attempt to assassinate the Emperor Napoleon, and that various companies were going on with a view to that end—all of which were vague and contradictory.

The United Service Gazette, under date of 12th inst., contains a list of 100 officers serving in India have tendered their resignation to Gen Sir John Campbell, G.C.B.

THE ATLANTIC TELEGRAPH.—Advice from Plymouth of May 25th gives accounts of successful experiments having been made in the laying of the Atlantic Telegraph Cable, and also of the gratifying intelligence that the expedition would sail for the great undertaking about the 31st of June.

THE LEVIATHAN.—The work of fitting the huge Leviathan for sea had been stopped, in consequence of the Company having run out of money. A scheme, however, has at length been proposed by which it is believed that the necessary capital for her equipment may be raised.

By the scheme the sum of £220,000 is to be raised by the sale of 12,000 debentures of £20 each, the holders of which are to receive an annuity of £5 per annum for eight years. Should the money be raised, which the directors entertain no doubt, the vessel will be fitted ready for sea in the early part of next year, when it is proposed to make an experimental trip to Lisbon, or some other convenient continental port.

FOREIGN-OFFICE DESPATCH.—The following telegraphic despatch from her Majesty's Acting Consul-General in Egypt was received at the Foreign-office, May 30, at 7 P.M.

ALEXANDRIA, May 25.—The steamer Gambia arrived at Suva yesterday, with Bombay dates to the 10th inst.
