Mrs. A. W. Cooke, widow of the late Canon Cooke, passed quietly away," hat her son's house, The RecMay 27th Mrs. Cooke was born at Halifax, 1837, and was connected, both on her mother's and father's side, with the early nava cendant of the old Lecain family on her mother's side, and her father Fêlix King, was a naval officer in the Admiralty Dock Yards.
