

THE NEW MOTOR:

Hammondsport, N.Y., Oct. 7, 1908:- The new eight cylinder 50 H.P. water-cooled motor being built for the A.E.A. differs from any motors previously built by this company in as much as it is water-cooled, and is of larger cylinder dimensions; the bore is 3 3/4" and the stroke 4".

The cylinders are placed in the form of a "V" four on a side as shown in the sketch, which also gives other dimensions.

This motor has mechanical intake valves and is built for durability and constant hard running. The engine alone will weigh about 175 pounds. G.H.C.
