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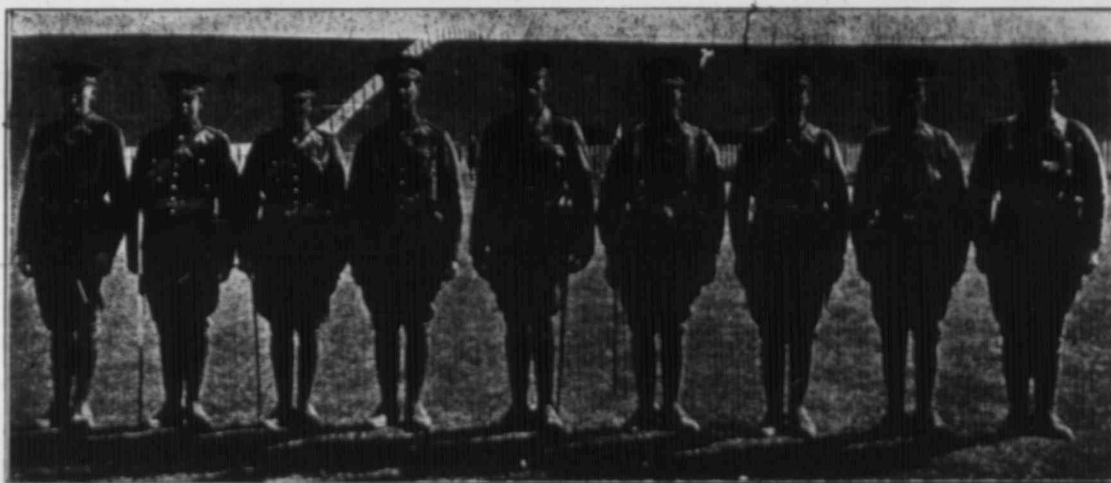

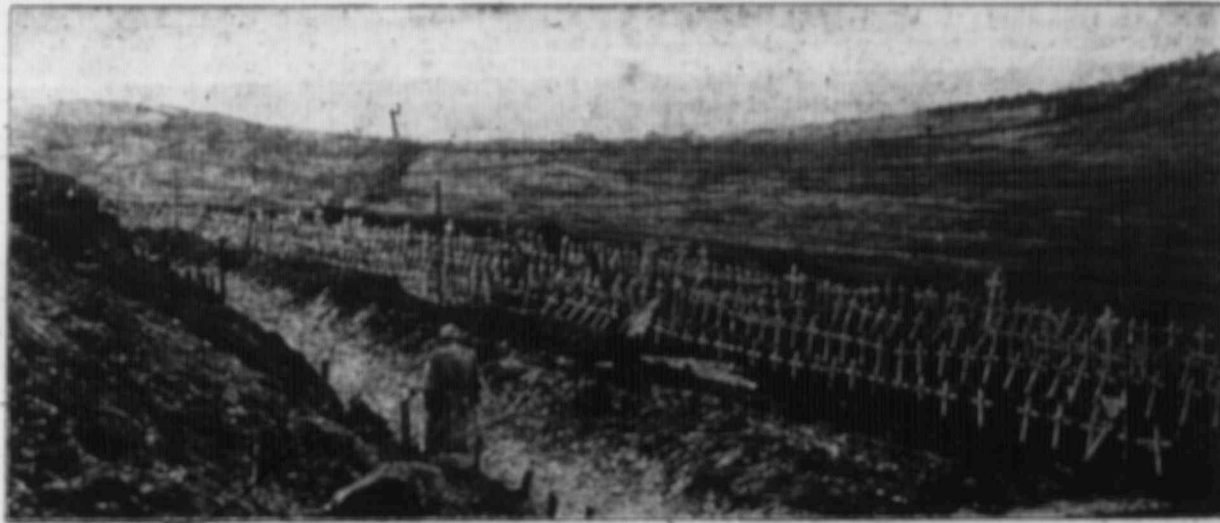
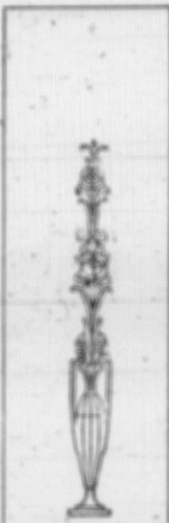
A French Cartoon Showing the Central Position in the Grip of the Allies
