An Act to amend the ninety-eighth chapter of the Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada.

[Assented to 15th August, 1866.]

ER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Preamble. Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

Every subject of Her Majesty and every citizen or sub- Her Majesty's ject of any foreign state or country who has at any time heresticore offended or may at any time hereafter offend against the provisions of this Act, is and shall be held to be guilty of felony, and may, notwithstanding the provisions hereinbefore contained, be prosecuted and tried before any Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery, in and for any County in Upper Canada, in the same manner as if the offence had been committed in such County, and upon conviction shall suffer death as a felon." suffer death as a felon."

In case any person shall be prosecuted and tried under sentence may the provisions of the next preceding section and found guilty, be carried out it shall and may be lawful for the Court before which such ding Con. Stat. trial shall have taken place, to pass sentence of death upon U. C. cap. 113. such person, to take effect at such time as the Court may direct, notwithstanding the provisions of an Act of the Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada, intituled : An Act respecting New Trials and Appeals and Writs of Error in criminal cases in Upper Canada.
