ON LIQUOR TRAFFIC

Carrying Down to Ruin Brighest and Best of Humanity, Declares Speaker

MEETING IN ALBERT

HOPEWILL HILL, Dec. 15.—Grand Worthy Patriarch E. S. Henniger of the Sons of Temperance, the most worthy chaplain, Rev. W. J. Kirby, and Edwin Wagstaff addressed a well attended public temperance meeting in the Methodist church at Albert last evening. The grand scribe, Rev. C. W. Hamilton, was expected to be present, but was prevented on account of pressure of work in connection with the Scott Act campaign in Westmorland county. Rev. Mr. Kirby presided. The grand worthy patriarch referred in a short address to the evils of strong drink, and urged the necessity of urgent efforts to promote the cause of temperance. Mr. Wagstaff, in a vigorous and eloquent address of considerable length, dealt with the great need of the professional temperance workers having more faith in the cause they pretended to espouse. It was no time, the speaker claimed, for indifference and mere approval when the ruin evil was carrying down to ruin the brightest and best of humanity. He admonished all who professed to have sympathy with the temperance cause to stand idly by, but to work unceasingly for the spread of those principles which were calculated to free from bondage the great mass who were held down by the terrible drink evil. The speaker deplored the lack of interest in temperance matters that he had noticed in different parts of the province.

A Montreal dispatch says: Nothing has been heard of the steamer Kristiania (Nor.), which passed in Belle Isle last Monday, bound for Seven Islands, 230 miles below Quebec, to load pulp wood for British port, since she was reported at Fortune Bay, west of Belle Isle Straits. She may have had to anchor on account of the severe storms which have swept the Gulf during the last few days. The Kristiania, a steamer of 1672 tons, built in Sunderland last year and owned in Norway.

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
