## Is This Pertinent?

### WHERE SHALL THE RAILWAY RUN?

The mind of the people has been absorbed so much in the question of securing the Valley Railway that the matter of its location through Carleton county has not been a public issue. Badly as the railway is needed the location by the last survey would render it a sectional benefit almost altogether. Situated near the boundary line as the survey is, the road would be certain to get all the traffic west of it, but there could not be any reasonable expectation of getting the traffic from more than half the territory between the road

and the river. Should the road follow the river bank throughout it would be certain of getting all the traffic of the west side of the fiver and a share of that from the east. The county would receive no

injury from the road running along the western bank of the river but the villages along the C. P. R. would be stunted in their development if the road follows the present survey. Presuming the river north of Woodstock divides evenly the population of the county, it is a question, if the matter were put to vote, if the road would suit all concerned by running so far toward the boundary line. The OBSERVER does not want to take sides in an issue of this kind but




