Miss Audrey Rideout is spending a few days at Four Falls.

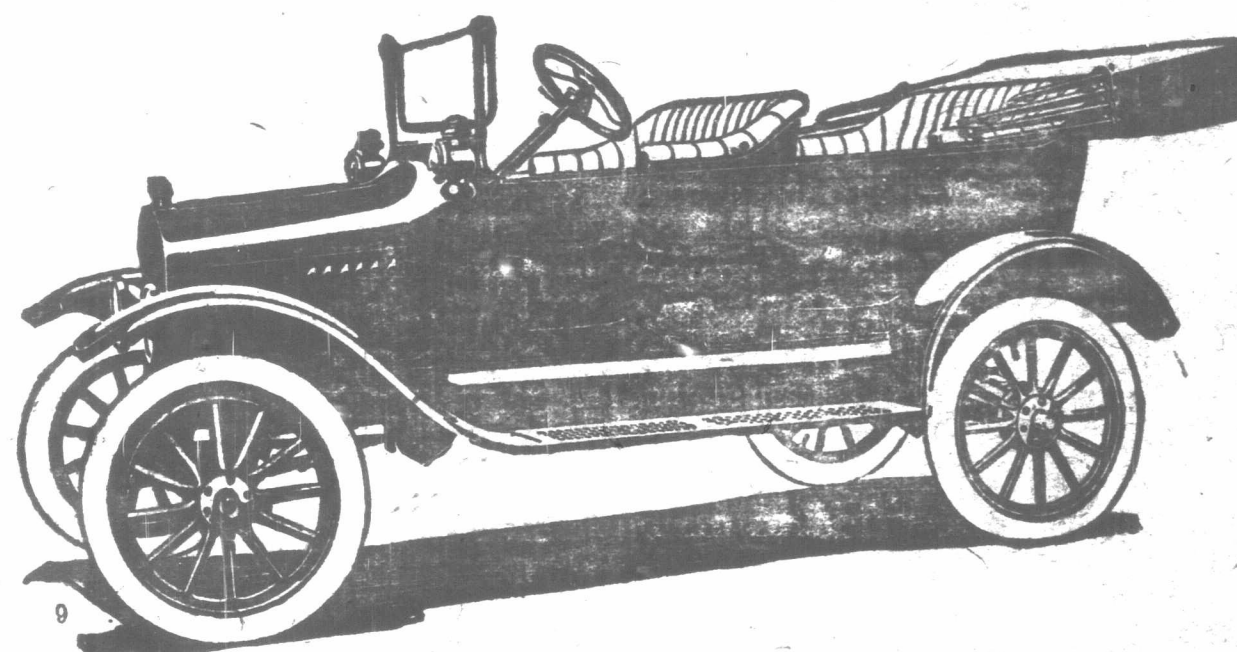
Mrs. Ivan Rivers returned Friday from a pleasant visit with friends at Clifforddale. She was accompanied by Miss Carrie Rivers.

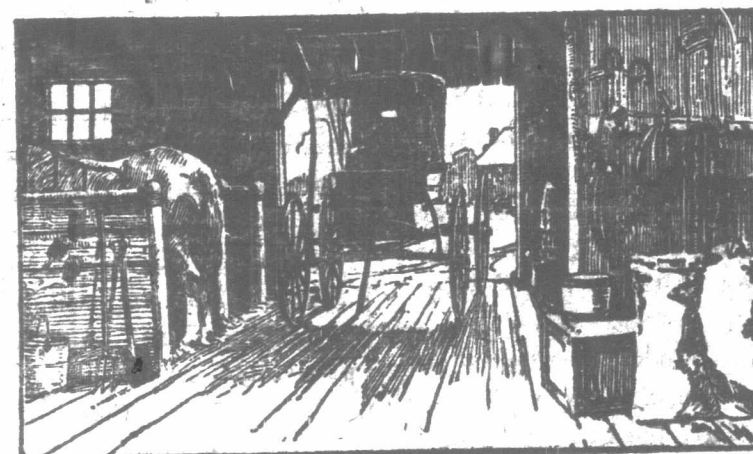

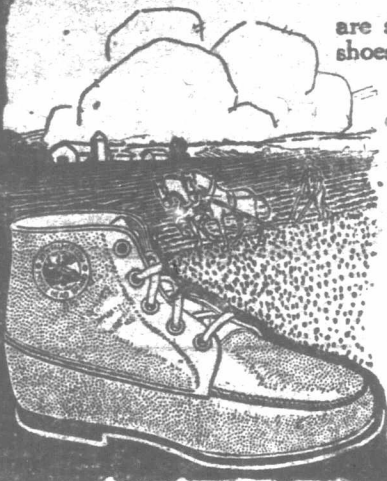

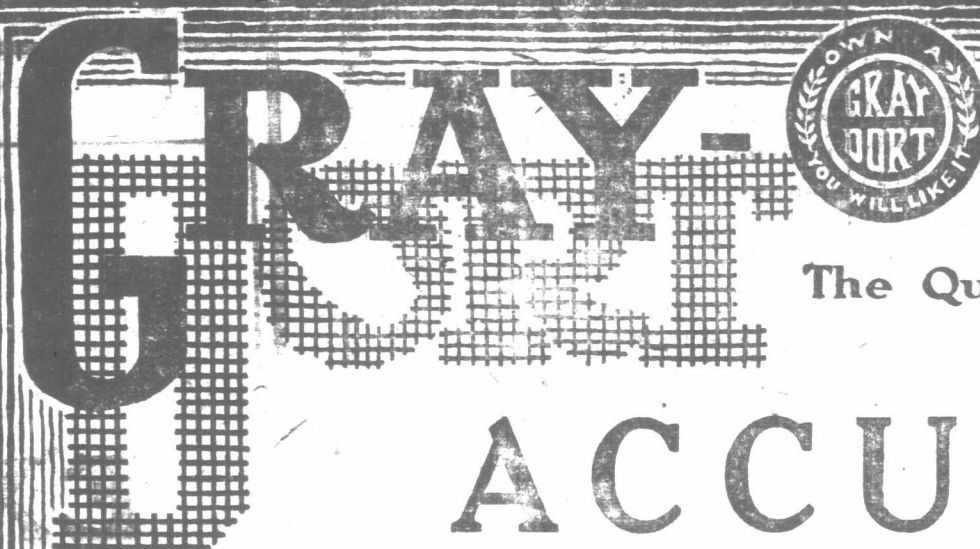
