The Tax Train.—Yesterday morning the private tea trade sales of tea commenced at the Custom House, and will be continued for some days. There was a full and active sale of the tea of all descriptions. The total quantity declared to be of 60,000 packages. During the day the demand was pretty active, at prices fully equivalent to those of yesterday. The tea of India, however, is still in great supply, this season from Bengal with the exports from Calcutta, which, in two or three years, will show a deficit.
