The allied fleets are the object of the greatest sympathy and attention on the part of the Swedes, Danes and Norwegians...

The combined fleets are still in Kavarna by the Russian fleet is at anchor in Sebastopol harbor...

The report that Odessa had surrendered to the combined fleets on the 14th inst., is not confirmed.

It is not unlikely that it will shortly do so. In fact, when the last mails left Constantinople, the declaration of war had only just reached there.

The greatest enthusiasm prevailed in consequence. French troops were daily arriving at Gallipoli.

General Canrobert and his staff had been presented to the Sultan, and most graciously received.

English troops were hourly expected. All the British troops had left Malta, and ere this have reached their destination.

The movement which John Mitchell is endeavoring to get up on your coast of the Atlantic in favor of Russia meets with no sympathy in Ireland, and is treated with total contempt in England.

The report of a great battle on the Danube is not confirmed. The Russians are strengthening their position on the Dobrujska, and the Turks near the Trajan Wall.

Lord Howden has sent a note to the Spanish government, requesting that in case any vessels with Russian letters of marque present themselves at any Spanish Port, they may be refused admittance.

The British troops are to be removed from Montreal and quartered at Quebec, Bermuda, and other places.

In Fredericton, N.S., they are blowing up the ice with gun-powder. An experiment was made on the 10th, where the ice was 22 inches thick, and over it were four inches of half melted snow.
