## Complete Abolition Of Divorce Is Urged

New York, March 27. Complete abolition of divorce is urged by Supreme Court Justice Morschauser, who presided over the Stillman case, in an article in the April number of Columbia, official organ of the Knights of Columbia made public Monday.

Declaring that he believed the abolition of divorce should be brought about by Congressional legislation, he added:
