## Course of Irish Elections Marred by Interference.

### Griffith Promises Investigation—Dublin University Votes for Treaty—T. P. Appeals on Behalf of Armenians—More Than Million Railway Men Favor Strike.

#### INTERFERENCE WITH ELECTIONS.

BELFAST, June 16. Many cases of interference with officials are reported from Sligo and East Mayo election areas. It is stated documents and voting papers were seized and burned in several districts and many agents of independent candidates were kidnapped. Replied to a protest sent to him, Arthur Griffith dispatched a message to the independent candidates saying the pact which provided for free elections had been broken. The matter would be investigated and if such conduct was perpetrated in the elections would be investigated. In some cases agents had been sent by post to Unionist voters warning them to remain home to-day.

#### AGENTS KIDNAPPED.

SLIGO, June 16. Agents of independent candidates in the Orange District here, were kidnapped this morning and removed to an unknown destination. Polling in Sligo and East Mayo Districts was brisk

the feature being the large number of women voters.

#### THE NEW CONSTITUTION.

LONDON, June 16. The Times, commenting on the new Irish Constitution, says if the Government's opinion is that it conforms with the Treaty is justified, one of the most serious obstacles to Irish peace will have been surmounted. The Daily News says nobody, willing to concede autonomy to Ireland, can well quarrel with the terms of the Constitution.

#### UNIVERSITY VOTED FOR TREATY.

DUBLIN, June 16. When the final results in the elections in the National University polling were about to be declared tonight, 13 armed men entered the polling office, held up the officials and seized the documents and tally sheets. Rory O'Connor, one of the leaders of the dissident faction of the Republican Army, led the raiders. The officials, however, had taken a copy of the results

which showed that in addition to Prof. John MacNeill, Speaker of Dail, and Prof. Michael Hayes, the Dail Minister of Education, who favor the Treaty, anti-Treaty candidates Prof. Stockley, and pro-Treaty independent Prof. McGinty, were elected, while Dr. A. B. English, and anti-Treaty, and Prof. Conway, pro-Treaty, were defeated. The Treaty votes polled at the University aggregated 1973, and anti-Treaty 670.

#### AN OVERWHELMING MAJORITY.

CINCINNATI, June 16. Rail Union chiefs were to-day considering serving formal notice on the Railway Labor Board that an overwhelming majority of 1,235,000 rail employees favored a strike against wage reductions.

#### RAILWAYMEN AND MINERS GETTING TOGETHER.

CINCINNATI, June 16. B. M. Jewell, President of the Railway Employees Department of the American Federation of Labor, was authorized to-day by the chiefs of the Railroad Shop and Crafts Unions to request a joint conference with the Union Mine Workers' officials to discuss joint action between the railroadmen in their threatened strike and the miners who have been on strike since April 1.

#### BELFAST'S DAMAGE CLAIMS.

BELFAST, June 16. Claims for damages growing out of fires and malicious injuries in Belfast since May 31, including cases only which individually amount to more than 1,000 pounds, total \$96,157 pounds. These do not come under the damage caused by more recent fires which easily totals 100,000 pounds. The damage between May 20th and 30th, amounted to 500,000 pounds.

#### ANOTHER CUT IN RAILWAY WAGES.

CHICAGO, June 16. Pruning nearly \$27,000,000 from the payroll of 325,000 railway employees by cutting clerks, signal men, and stationary firemen from two to six cents an hour, the United States Railway Labor Board announced to-day another wage slash bringing the total reductions under the Board's orders up to \$135,000,000 beginning July 1st. Approximately 1,200,000 railway employees share in the total reduction, which has brought a vigorous protest from every Union involved and is expected to result in a strike vote by the ten railway labor bodies.

#### T. P. APPEALS TO L. G.

LONDON, June 16. T. P. O'Connor has appealed to Lloyd George to arrange with France to stop Turkish massacres of Christians in Asia Minor. He said 1,300 women and children had been murdered near Kastak two weeks ago, according to the Greek Patriarch of Constantinople.

#### ENTRAPPED IN CAPSIZED SHIP.

HAMBURG, June 16. Many men were entrapped in the hold of the Brazilian liner Avare when the capsized to-day while being hauled out of the dry dock. Openings were being forced this afternoon in the hold in efforts to save the men while the liner lay submerged two-thirds of her extent. The Avare, 8,225 tons gross, is owned by the Brazilian Lloyd Co. and was formerly the Sierra Nevada and was handed to Brazil under the terms of the Peace Treaty.
