Some twenty years before the latter date the Philistine who defeated King Saul of Israel upon the neighbouring Mount Gilboa hung his body to the walls of Beth-Shan and placed his armor in the House of the Goddess Ashtoreth. This very house of Ashtoreth has been found this season. In a room of this house and from under its floor, which was made of hard clay, came a most important monument of basalt, dedicated by an

Egyptian named Hesi-Nekht, who lived under the Nineteenth Dynasty. This depicts a figure of the Goddess Ashtoreth, or Antit (Anaitis). In front of her is Hesi-Nekht and an altar stand with a lily over it. Above her is writ-ten, "Analtis, lady of heaven, mistress of all the gods," and against the man "May the King give an offering. Analtis, may she give all life, strength, and health to the double of Hesi-Nekht."
