ELECTION NEWS.

In Stormont Mr Bethune has been elected for this county by a majority of 34 over Mr Colquhoun, the Patent Combination candidate. Every possible means were employed by Mr Colquhoun and his friends to defeat Mr Bethune. Mr Sandfield Macdonald, with his retainers, prominent amongst whom was the Cornwall Postmaster, were exceedingly active throughout the campaign—Sandfield driving night and day for a week past and standing at the polls at the Township Hall, Roxborough. Sandfield is greatly elagined over the defeat of his candidate.

EDITORIAL NEWS.

THE London Telegraph of the 10th ultimo, says:—We need feel no surprise at the announcement from Washington, that the British and American Commission has declined to admit the liability of the United States for debts contracted by the confederates. This decision, of course, shuts out the claims advanced by the unfortunate holders of the Confederate cotton bonds, who have so long agitated for something like a recognition of the loan. Nothing else was to be expected. It does not at all matter whether the Bondholder's Committee were right in the suspicions which they expressed to Lord Granville, that the rejection of their demands was a pre-arranged conclusion. The simple truth had better be frankly admitted at once; it was absurd to suppose that Americans would ever admit such a claim.

FROM THE NILE.—The report reaches us that Sir Samuel Baker's Nile expedition has been a complete failure. A mutiny appears to have broken out among his followers (principally Egyptians), when they got beyond the bounds of civilisation, and in endeavoring to quell this intrepid explorer received a wound, from the effects of which he subsequently died. Like the reported death of Dr. Livingstone, however, this may after all turn out to be a mere sensational dispatch.
