ANOTHER SOCCER DIFFICULTY IS SETTLED BY PRESIDENT GOW

Dispute About Eligibility of Player Who Is Signed With One Club, Leaves City, and Then Returns, Causes Warm Discussion; Gow Takes Firm Stand

RESIDENCE RULE IN SOCCER DEFINED
In future no player who is registered for one club in Calgary can go out of the district and play for another club in a recognized competition, whether that club be affiliated to the Association or not. All players must be resident in the district ten days after signing for a club before they are eligible to play.

President Gow at City Football League Meeting.
PRESIDENT GOW last night at the meeting of the Calgary City and District Football League, certainly continued cleaning house with a vengeance. He overturned accepted ideas by the score, in regard to the rules, and went further by declaring in no uncertain fashion the position which the Calgary City and District Football League will have to take during the rest of the season.

The whole matter came up when Alce Melville of the Hillhurst club complained about the playing of Frank Johnson by the Calles in their game against Hillhurst. "He was sure," because he was in the same position last year, he claimed, and he was quoted as saying that he would hardly let the matter drop, after the president gave his ruling. President Gow lost no time in setting the minds of the league committee at rest. He said:

"The point on which you have asked me to give a ruling appears in rule 17. It is quite clear and any explanation seems to be unnecessary. Every player in this association is required to reside in the district for ten days prior to taking part in any competition."

"When the proper time comes I am prepared to suggest several amendments and additions to the constitution and rules. Meanwhile, it will be necessary for me to give a ruling which shall define the eligibility of players taking part in league games and other competitions governed by the Calgary City and District Football League during the balance of the season 1913."

"The ruling is as follows: All players must be bona-fide residents of the district for at least ten days, and be registered by the club for which they play for at least ten days prior to taking part in any competition governed by the association. No player will be eligible who has been registered for any other league or who has taken part in any competition outside the district, whether that competition be a friendly or a registration form signed by the league at the request of the club for which he plays."

W. Reeves took the matter up of a game being assigned without the consent of the two clubs concerned, and notified of the matter, but as the point to which he referred was intermediate business, it was referred to them.

Committee for Scotland-England Game.
The committee for the Scotland-England international game on July 8, was selected as follows:—Scots: President Gow, Vice-President Scott, and Jack McLean, England: Messrs. George Taylor, H. E. Sheldon, and George Broughton. Mr. P. Gillespie was the unanimous choice for referee.

The secretary reported that the medals in both divisions were ready, and Mr. Atwood voiced the general feeling when he said that the league should have a smoking concert. President Gow wanted everything done that would help football along, and was in hearty sympathy. The league will hold a smoker for the senior league presentation, and the Intermediate will be allowed to settle the matter so far as they are concerned in the way they prefer. The gathering will be one of the most cosmopolitan and hearty, and is a fitting climax and honor to the club which has won the championship for the last nine years.

Inter-City Games.
Edmonton will be in Calgary on July 19, and there will be a selection made from the teams which will appear at the international and afterwards. Then it is suggested that August 2 and 10 be given as the probable dates for the return game. At Edmonton, the date August 6, which was suggested by Edmonton, not being suitable to Calgary, in view of the fact that the Calgary-Caledonian games will be held on that date. The league voted \$10 towards the prize fund of the games. Mr. MacKinlay, of the Lacrosse association, was present at the meeting and felicitations were exchanged. It is believed that the lacrosse men will have the hearty co-operation of the soccer men in their endeavor to keep the game going, and interchanges such as that of last night are sure to do good.

PURE MILK DEPOT TO BE OPENED IN CITY ON TUESDAY
Will Be Supplied Gratis For Babies Where Parents Cannot Afford the Price

Calgary is going to have pure milk at last. The idea of a pure milk depot, which originated in the mind of one man only, but in that of a woman and a woman simultaneously, the man being Dr. Mahood and the woman Miss McPherson of the General Hospital.

The whole idea has been worked up until now it intends going into operation on Tuesday. Behind the scheme are Alderman Trellius, Dr. Mahood, Dr. Blow, Dr. Ebert and Rev. D. A. McKillop. The milk will be brought from the Hayes dairy at Carleton Place, Ontario, and will be up-to-date dairies in existence, will be in fact, the first in Alberta, and bearing the Red Cross mark. The milk will not be sterilized but will be kept in a large refrigerator and bottled in the offices, which are next to the office of the Associated Charities. There will be a doctor and a nurse in attendance at the offices and advice will be given gratis on the care and attention of babies, as this movement has been chiefly started to give infant life a chance. All persons are welcome to visit the depot and see the milk supply, and if the summer attempt proves a success the institution of this pure milk may become permanent.

Follows a copy of the notice which was yesterday sent out to all doctors in the city:

Dear Dr.: We are opening a pure milk depot Tuesday, July 2nd, at 1000 10th St. N. W. The depot will be open daily from 9 a. m. to 6 p. m.

A qualified nurse will be in attendance to prepare the milk and any instructions given for the care of children by the medical profession will be imparted to the parents. The charge will be 12 1/2 cents per quart, or 7 1/2 cents per pint, but where the head of a family cannot pay we shall be only too happy to supply the milk gratis. We would be pleased to have you visit the depot at any time and in cases of poverty pure milk is needed a card from you will supply that need.
