MME. LOYSON IN CHICAGO

Endeavoring to Abolish Auricular Con

Endeavoring to Abcitsh Auricular Confession and Latin Sermons.

CHICAGO, Sept. 19.—She is a woman with a strong face and a commanding figure. Her raven black hair is combed smooth from over her white, broad forehead, her eyes are bright and intelligent, and she speaks English fluently, as it is her native tongue, and French with a soft, euphonous intonation that is rarely found in those who acquire that language. She reached Chicago last Monday, and is at the home of Mrs. James Hewitt, Washington avenue, Hyde Park. Her name is Mme. Hyacinthe Loyson, and she is the wife of Pere Hyacinthe, the famous French priest. In 1869 the religious world was startled by the letter of Pere Hyacinthe, which renounced the infallibility of the Pope, repudiated the compulsory celibacy of the priesthood, and called for the abolition of forced auricular confession, and services in the exercise. orced auricular confession, and services in

the vernacular.

The religious world stood aghast at these demands, and seers prophesied an other reformation, the disintregration of the Roman Catholic Church and a new sec the Roman Canonic Church and a new sect supplanting it. And the surprise was in-creased when the Carmelite monk, the now famous Pere Hyacinthe, not only an-nounced his renunciation of papal author-ity, but sealed his determination by marry-

nounced his renunciation of papal authority, but sealed his determination by marrying an American woman.

Since then Pere Hyacinthe and his most zealous helper, his wife, have toiled night and day for the success of their new church, the idea of which is, in fine, that the church shall be Catholic, but not Roman Catholic, It is meant by this that all the sects and churches shall be united in the universal religion of Christ.

THE GALLIC CHURCH.

The Gallic Church, as it is called, claims not to be schismatic or sectarian, not a reformation even, but a restoration. For Pere Hyacinthe's church has as its chief tenet the purpose of returning to and reviving the forms practiced by the first Christians in the first centuries after Christians in the first centuries atter Christians in the first centuries atter Christians in the first centuries atter Christians in the primitive religion of the Ope of Rome. The idea is to do away with all sects and divisions and bring back the primitive religion of the Gauls in the Catholic but non-Roman faith. In order to gain this the accessions from Rome demanded are: The abolition of auricular confession, vernacular service, and forced celibacy of the clergy, the election of the clergy, and the resumption of the privilege of offering the Bible to the people and the cup to the laity at the communion.

Since Pere Hyacinthe's excommunication he has worked ceaselessly for the Gallican Church. Many things have conspired against the successful termination of his ideas. The French Republic is not all that designation would imply to the American. France still holds allegiance to Rome, the French people being regularly taxed for the support of the Roman Catholic Church in that country, the Government paying bishops and priests. It is not so easy a matter for the Gallican Church to gain a footing.

HER MISSION IN AMERICA.

There are 33,000,000 people in France. Of these 2,000,000 are for the most part non-church going, but it is claimed by the followers of the Gallican creed, were its belief properly presented before them, they would espouse its cause. Pere Hyacinthe is loved by the French people. Although he is 65 years of age, his elequence still thrills his hearers wherever he may go in France.
