In regard to the Parkhill postmastership wirepulling, to which reference has already been made in these columns, a correspondent on the ground writes: Mr. John Noble, who for 30 years has been postmaster at Parkhill, and has grown gray in the service, has been asked by the department to tender his resignation, because of alleged irregularities, but, in effect, his friends say, because the son of the member for the riding wants the post. Mr. Noble had always been a Reformer in politics until last election, when, owing to pressure from outside, he supported the candidacy of Mr. Butchins, who secured the seat. Some time after the election a petition was circulated and sent down to Ottawa, making charges of negligence against the postmaster. Inspector Sweetnam went up to Parkhill and made an investigation. It was shown that several cases had occurred such as are common in all country postoffices. One day people had been told there were no letters for them, and next day received letters that had been lying in the office and forgotten. Sometimes letters were found in the wrong lock-boars. Several years before there had been a defalcation by one of the clerks, but Mr. Noble had paid that out of his own pocket and hired new clerks, From conversation with him while in Parkhill it was believed that nothing warranting Mr. Noble's retirement had been discovered by Mr. Swectnam. As a result of that wist, however, the postmaster was asked to resign, and, on making application for a copy of the report, was told that the rules forbade any explanation. Nothing very far wrong, perhaps, but at once Mr. Frank Hutchins, son of the member, began circulating a petition to have himself appointed postmaster. His father and the postmaster had been on bad terms personally for years, but the cleder Mr. Hutchins and and the people could petition for whoever they wanted.
