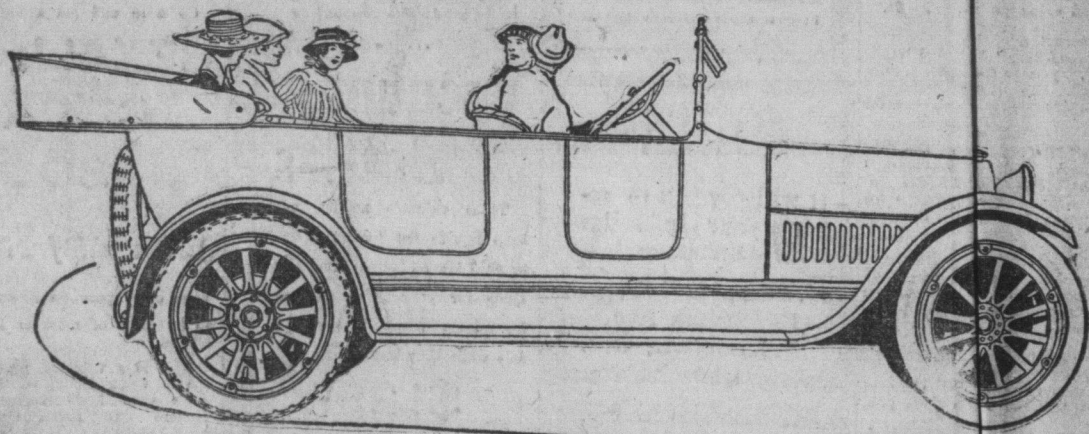

Sub Campaign Proves Failure

Baron Rhondda Says Voluntary Rationing Working Well.

London, June 29.—While we should not be too optimistic regarding the food situation, for we cannot tell what the morrow will bring forth, there is no fear at present that the Germans will force England to adopt compulsory rationing because of their submarine campaign," said Baron Rhondda, the food controller to the American correspondents to-day. Baron Rhondda added that the voluntary rationing system was working admirably and the crops of the country were doing well.

In regard to his plans for food control, he declared that he was first of all going to consider the interests of the consumer and he was very sanguine that he would be able to abolish excessive profits in foodstuffs and to reduce prices. Referring to the American food bill Baron Rhondda said: "I am watching the final stages of American food legislation with profound interest and admiration for its comprehensiveness and far sightedness. When the Senate settles many knotty points that were bound to arise and when food administration becomes part of the American Governmental machinery, all the entente allied food ministries will be able to make their provisions for the future, both as regards the supply and the price, with a far greater degree of certainty."

Austria Would Have Peace Without Annexations

Amsterdam, June 27.—Dr. Constantine Dumba, the former Austrian ambassador at Washington, in an article in the Vienna Neue Freie Presse advocates peace without annexation or indemnities, however disappointing that formula may sound to the Chauvinists.

D. Dumba speaking from the Austro-Hungarian standpoint, considers that if the Serbian danger can be held in check by the permanent winning own of our turbulent neighbor, and our own territories remain untouched, we shall have every reason to welcome a solution.

Looks Out For Austria.
Dr. Dumba's ideas are, briefly: Russia to restore the occupied Austro-Hungarian territory occupied by the Austro-Germans. The re-establishment of Poland. Austria to make certain frontier modifications, for reasons of strategic safety. (for instance, she ought to retain possession of Belgrade and Mount Lovchen, in Montenegro).

The Roumanian wheat crops must be secured to the central powers by treaty. Italy must evacuate Valona (Avlona) and free navigation of the Adriatic must be guaranteed. Austria will assist Russia to obtain an unhampered exit from the Black
