Prefers Death to Surrender

Sultan of Morocco Declares He Will Perish in Defence of Fez.

Moors Consider European Ideas and Christians Responsible for Rebellion.

London, Dec. 31.—The Tangier correspondent of the Times telegraphs that the Sultan has told a deputation at Fez that he is prepared to die in defence of the town. The Moors are confident, continues the correspondent, after what passed between Menebihi, who visited London last year, as Moorish ambassador, and Foreign Secretary Lansdowne, that in case of necessity, Great Britain cannot refuse to give the Sultan assistance.

It is impossible to disabuse them of this idea, as they lay the entire responsibility for the present rebellion at Great Britain's door for fostering European ideas and introducing Christians into the Moorish country.

Madrid, Dec. 30.—Telegrams from Tangier say the Sultan's troops have abandoned the fortress of Rasmeia, close to Fez, and the pretender is negotiating the situation to be serious, but not desperate. After a cabinet meeting here tonight, Foreign Minister Abarca expressed a more hopeful view of the Moroccan situation. He said he thought it not likely that the rebels would capture Fez. He further stated that the Moors would not be satisfied with the belief that no complications would ensue through the actions of other powers.

It is reported here that the Sultan of Morocco has been foiled in an attempt to break out of Fez by the rebels who are investing that city.

A despatch from Tangier, Morocco, today, announces that the rebels have taken the aqueduct which supplies Fez with water, and added that the city is now practically without water. It was further asserted that unless the Kabyle tribesmen from the South come to the aid of Fez, the place must surrender within three days.

Great Britain and France have notified Spain that they have no intention of taking any advantage of the situation in Morocco, and that they desire the maintenance of the status quo, even in the event of the Sultan being deposed and his place taken by the pretender. These communications have reassured the Spanish government, which is relieved of fears of international complications.

MORE BODIES ARE FOUND

Five Victims of the Mollie Gibson Mine Have Been Discovered.

Nelson, B. C., Dec. 30.—The body of S. M. Campbell was brought to light this morning from the Mollie Gibson mine. So far no relatives of the deceased have been heard from, but a number of people who think they knew him, will seek to identify the body.

The body found yesterday morning, which could not be identified at the time, has proved to be that of M. S. Hall, the assayer. His father and brother-in-law arrived in the city today from Tekoa, Wash., and will take the corpse tomorrow as far as Spokane, and home the following day. Three other bodies have been found, only one of which, Louis Broule, has been identified.

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Will Demand The Railway

Agitation Is to Be Commenced Favoring the E. & V. Extension.

Petitions Will Be Circulated All Over Vancouver Island.

Some of the more public-spirited men in the island are determined that the year 1903 shall witness a strenuous attempt on the part of the people of Vancouver Island to secure the extension of the railway from Wellington to the Northern end of the island.

A meeting of gentlemen who appreciate the great advantages which would result to Victoria in the opening up of the immense resources of the island, was held within the past few days, and a "Colonist" reporter was informed yesterday that it was determined to arrange for the circulation of a monster petition at every point of settlement on the island, and when the petition was signed, to present copies of it to the provincial and federal governments, and to each of the members representing the island in Ottawa.
