On the other hand, if we ignore these distinctions and consider the distribution as between those families under £1,000 a year and those over that figure, it is our considered opinion, after surveying the whole position—it cannot be put any higher—that the class in excess of £1,000 a year per family has considerably increased in proportion to the whole community; and that the aggregate income of this class, taken as a whole, is now enormously larger than it was before the war—so much larser, in fact, as to leave its net receipts, after paying away possibly nearly half the total in income tax, super-tax and excess profits duty, positively no less than they were before the war. Taking the families of £1,000 a year and unwards as a whole, the full amount of the unprecedented direct taxation has been met by the increase in gross income. The net incomes do not go so far as they did; and in the sense of disappointed expectation the mere £1,000 a year family suffers more than that of the artisan."
