Regulations For Staughtering Our Cuttle, LONDON, May 8. The Official Grzette publishes an order directing that Canadian cattle imported to England be marked at the ports of arrival and that they be isolated and killed at special abbatoirs. The carcasses of such cattle are not to be removed without the permission of the inspector of the Board of Husbandry. In addition, the lungs of these cattle are not to be touched until examined by the inspectors. The order goes into force on May 15.
