GOOD ROADS REVENUE

It is announced that the revenue of the Province derived the licensing of motor cars and trucks will total almost three million dollars for the year 1921. Every dollar of that revenue that is spent on road building or the payment of interest on bonds ssued for road building is spent outside the boundaries of the cities and towns of Ontario on Provincial roads although the dwellers in cities and towns contribute almost two-thirds of

In Toronto and its vicinity, where a fifth of the people of Ontario live and over a fifth of the license revenue is obtained, practically no return has been made for this great contribution. The city not only maintains its roads at its own cost, but helps to maintain the leading roads throughout York county, and materially assisted in building the Hamilton Highway, which stretches across Peel, Halton, and a part of Went-

worth counties. Not only does the Province refuse to do anything towards road building in the urban centres, but the Dominion Government grant for good roads, which comes out of the pockets of all country, is also spent entirely on country roads. It is important that these facts shall be spread among the people of Ontario. There is an impression abroad that costly roads are being built throughout the Province chiefly for the benefit of city motorists at the general expense. That is far from the truth. The country roads the cost of motorists, including those who live in cities and towns. The cities and towns build their own roads at their own cost .- Globe.



From it of Ontario are being built largely at we learn that Canadian Live Stock continues to maintain its enviable reputation as among the healthiest in the world, that none of the great plagues, such as rinderpest, foot-and mouth disease and contagious pleuropneumonia, has been allowed to enter the country; that hog cholera and glanders have been so effectively dealt with that losses have become comparatively trifling, and that mange has been practically eradicated from the great range country of Alberta. The last mentioned was a particularly heavy task, as can easily be understood when it is stated that 2,082 townships, aprpoximately 74,952 miles, a territory as large as Scotland, had to be covered. Cattle could stray for hundreds of miles. Restrictions and dipping regulations had to be imposed and happily were readily complied with by cattlemen, with one lone exception, when the police had to be called upon. Dipping vats were built so that no cattle would have to be driven more than contingency was provided for.
