THE CHAPEL OF THE ASCENSION.

ON the afternoon of Palm Sunday, 1892, after witnessing the pomp and pride and pageantry of the rival Christian communions in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, as a truer commemoration of the sacred events of the day, I went forth with my fellow-pilgrims to the sites and scenes of Palestine, from the Holy City to the Mount of Olives. We traversed the Via Dolorosa, the "Sorrowful Way," trodden by the feet of the Saviour on his way to Calvary. Emerging from St. Stephen's Gate we passed the scene of the death of the forerunner of the noble army of martyrs. Beneath

our eyes lay the storied vale of Kedron, and on its opposite side rose the long slopes of the Mount of Olives.

To the left of the winding way is a stone-walled area depressed several feet below the road. Fronting this, a picturesque double
