Mr. Sproule has introduced a bill at Ottawa to compel detective and mercantile agencies to register with the names of the partners, etc., with the secretary of state and dopoint a bond of \$10,000 for proper performance of duties, to provide for their being wound up and to forbid them acting as collecting agents.
