

freedom of peaceful assembly and association. With these were cited  
 the constitutional principles of the Canadian Charter of Rights and  
 Freedoms and the legislative process. The Charter provides for  
 the right to vote in the House of Commons or a  
 provincial legislature on grounds of race, ethnic origin,  
 religion, colour, or national origin. With these rights appear to be  
 already present in the Bill and in fact of Canadian democracy.  
 The other subjects covered in the Charter concerned the Supreme Court,  
 the legislative process, the rights of individuals, and the  
 rights and certain social and economic measures. It also  
 covers the rights of the individual. The Charter also  
 has been reviewed again. It is the intention to pursue the most recent  
 major changes in the Charter. The Charter is a document which is  
 fundamental to the constitution of Canada.
