6. Since tenders are mainly obtained by public advertisement, past performance on payment of accounts is a factor in determining acceptability of tender or alternately requiring the posting of a labour and materials payment bond.

7. Clause 21 of the general conditions of the contract permits Her Majesty to discharge lawful obligations of, and satisfy lawful claims against the contractor or a sub-contractor arising out of the execution of the work to the extent that moneys are available to do so under the contract.

1. The National Film Board proposes to institute a service charge for the use of its films, effective January 1, 1970. Schools and other educational institutions will not be exempt from paying this service charge if they wish to use NFB material.

The budgetary implications of this new policy were discussed with provincial departments of education in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland, before the change in policy was made known; elsewhere, provincial departments of education were consulted shortly after they received, in the third week in November, a letter intimating the change in policy.
