kinds of grain need to be grown?

Mr. Lang: The best opinion available, as indicated in such things as the Outlook Conference, was that the acreage available for grains and crops other than wheat last year was about the right amount of acreage for those crops again this year. That does not mean that each crop should have the same acreage. Indeed it is indicated that there should be some increases in some crops and small decreases in others. It means that there is in fact only a small margin of room for additional production in the total non-wheat area, and this leads to the problem of what to do with land if it is moving out of wheat production. The obvious thing that must be avoided is that it go in great quantity into the non-wheat crops and produce serious oversupply in those areas.

Mr. George Muir (Lisgar): Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct a supplementary question to the Minister without Portfolio. In his reply to the Leader of the Opposition he said that some farmers had enough wheat to supply the market for the next two years.
