"May I add a personal suggestion of a general nature. On account of my age, its adoption cannot affect myself. The suggestion is that when university expenditures are made on account of an increase of students and for further equipment, these should not be such as will prevent deserved and well-earned increases (and promotions) for existing members of the teaching staff. <sup>a</sup> Faculties and departments may sometimes be in fault in this matter. Too extravagant requisitions and demands on the part of some may result in disappointment, financial worry and anxiety to others."
