BY LAWS, &c.

BY-LAW of the Municipal Council of the District of Johnstown relating to Statute Labour.

The Council of the District of Johnstown duly assembled in Council, in the Town of Brockville, on Wednesday the Ninth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, in virtue of an Act passed in the 4th and 5th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to provide for the better internal government of that part of this Province which formerly constituted the Province of Upper Canada, by the establishment of Local or Municipal Authorities therein," do ordain and enact the following By-Law, and it is hereby enacted, That all persons within the said District, who now are, or who may hereafter be liable to perform Statute Labour, shall be at liberty to do and perform such statute labour, under such restrictions, regulations and enactments as are hereinafter contained.

SECTION 2. That where the labour is not done and performed either by the person, who in law, is liable to do and perform the ame, or by some one or more of his or her children, domestics r servants, it shall be the duty of every such person so negecting or refusing, and he or she, is hereby required within ight days notice to that effect from the overseer of the division o pay into the hands of such overseer, the sum of Two Shillings and Six Pence, in lieu of every days labour, which he or she was liable in law to have done and performed.

SECTION 3. That a notice, whether verbal or written, from the Overseer of Roads for the Division, delivered personally to ny individual liable to perform statute labour, or to the wife, hild, servant or other domestic of such individual, (such child, ervant or domestic, being of the full age of twelve years,)
