The Cabinet in Session.

The Bell's Corners infantry arrived here this morning; they are anxious to be sent to the front.

A Cabinet Council was held this forenoon. Another will be held at nine o'clock this evening.

At 11 a.m. to-day the Ottawa field battery, together with rifle companies Nos. 1 and 3 and 178 men of the P. C. O. Rifle Brigade left by special train for Prescott.
