SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskaichewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made attany agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homestedger may live within nine miles of his homestedd on a farm of at least 20 acres solely when and occupied by him or by his father, mother, sen, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-up to quiarter-rection alongside his newestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Dutler. Its reside upon the homestead of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
