

Naval Conflict on In Grim Earnest

The Not a Trafaigar Affair, Battle With Salvage Men is Real Thing.

NEW YORK, Feb. 28.-(C.A.P.)-A London cable says: The British navy is now engaged in a battle with the salvage force which has been directing the operations to raise the submarine A3, which was recently lost off the Isle of Wight. The trouble is caused by the bitter criticism of the admiralty's own lack of salvage apparatus, which caused the authorities to decide to take matters in their own hands. But the Sea Salvage Company's boat, under the command of Dr. Carlo Iberte, declined to quit operations, and a skirmish took place yes, terday, the navy being represented by two destroyers, two torpedo boats, one gunboat and several tugs and lighters.
